PROCEDURES

Major Incident Management Plan and Bushfire, Storm and Flood Sub Plans

Major Incident Management Plan

FRNSW's <u>Major Incident Management Plan</u> has been reviewed and a revised Version 02 has been published on the intranet.

The <u>Major Incident Management Plan</u> ensures that FRNSW provides effective, coordinated response to major incidents in NSW in support of the <u>State Emergency Management Plan</u> (EMPLAN).

Key points

- A new Alert Level 3, *Stand Down*, has been included. It covers demobilisation and return to business as usual.
- The role of Liaison Officers is explained in more detail.
- The sections relating to requests for assistance and costs have been revised to match the *Finance Supporting Plan*.

Sub plans to the *Major Incident Management Plan* detail requirements for dealing with specific types of incidents and should be read in conjunction with the *Major Incident Management Plan* and the sub plans to EMPLAN.

Bushfire Sub Plan

The <u>Bushfire Sub Plan</u> to the *Major incident management plan* has been reviewed and the revised Version 02 has been published on the intranet.

Key points

- The section on Community Fire Units has been revised, incorporating changes to policies and procedures.
- The section on Public Information has been updated based on the revised *Operational Communications Service Level Agreement* with the Rural Fire Service.
- The sections relating to requests for assistance and costs have been revised to match the *Finance Supporting Plan*.

Storm and Flood Sub Plans

The following new sub plans to the *Major incident management plan* have been published on the intranet:

- <u>Storm Sub Plan</u>
- Flood Sub Plan

Key points

The purpose of the Storm Sub Plan and the Flood Sub Plan is to:

• Ensure FRNSW provides an effective response to major storms and floods in coordination with the NSW State Emergency Service (NSW SES)

- Ensure FRNSW meets its obligations under the <u>NSW State Storm Plan</u> and the <u>NSW State Flood Plan</u>
- Set the context for FRNSW input into Regional and Local Emergency Management Plans and sub plans of the *NSW State Storm Plan* and the *NSW State Flood Plan*.

Strike Team Formation Group Supporting Plan to the Major Incident Management Plan

The <u>Strike Team Formation Group Supporting Plan</u> to the <u>Major Incident Management Plan</u> has been published on the <u>Major Incident Management Plans</u> toolkit on the intranet.

Key points

- 1. The *Strike Team Formation Group Supporting Plan* ensures that the People & Culture Directorate has effective arrangements are in place to recall off duty permanent firefighters from the Greater Sydney Area to staff strike teams for major incidents.
- 2. It includes the principles that apply to the recall of off-duty permanent firefighters.

Who needs to read the plan?

All staff involved in managing strike teams during major incidents should read this plan. Permanent firefighters in the Greater Sydney Area who may be recalled to staff a strike team should also be familiar with this plan.

A <u>Fumigation toolkit</u> has also been published, presenting all information relating to fumigation in one place.

Key change

The documents reflect the current Pesticides Regulation 2017. The most significant change to this SOG is to outline that pest controllers are not required to place warning signs at premises when pest treatment is underway, except in the case of common areas of multiple-occupancy residential complexes. Multiple-occupancy residential complexes include apartments, townhouses, and long-stay caravan parks.

Firefighters need to be more vigilant for indicators that fumigation may be in progress at any building, including residential buildings.
