PROCEDURES

Electricity SOGs

Electricity is a hazard for firefighters at fires. The Electricity SOGs have been updated.

The eLearning modules for Electricity have also been updated on Learning Station.

Key points

The updates include the following:

- Updated instructions regarding what to do if you get an electric shock, in line with the current policy *Workers requiring medical assistance and transportation*.
- Added instructions on Wires Down incidents, including use of MDT, in line with current Wires Down protocols.
- Incorporated instructions from bulletins and toolkit about:
 - National Broadband Network.
 - o Static electricity.
 - Electrical safety kit.
 - Low voltage energised equipment.
- Broadened references to hybrid vehicles to include electric vehicles, plus added information about electric charging stations.
- New information about battery energy storage systems (BESS).
- New information about solar panel fires.

What needs to be done?

Station Commanders must ensure that all crews are aware of the contents of the SOGs. All operational staff must sign off the SOGs – station staff sign off in the Station Planning System (SPS); operational staff not attached to a station sign off in Employee Self Service (ESS).

Infection Prevention and Control Manual 2020

Key points

Utilising Government Legislation, Regulations and Guidelines, evidence-based knowledge and referencing FRNSW's current doctrine, FRNSW subject matter experts have revised the previous edition of the Infection Prevention and Control Manual. Though the major content matter is largely unchanged, there have been some existing information updates, references and refinements making it a more straightforward manual for which FRNSW staff to refer.

Information regarding COVID-19 is not included in the Infection Prevention and Control Manual due to the uniqueness and transitory nature of this disease and the potential for changes to response accordingly to the current Government guidelines. The <u>COVID-19</u> <u>portal</u> will continue to supply current information to all FRNSW staff to access and will continue to be updated accordingly.

Who needs to read the plan?

To assist firefighters adopt a proactive approach to infection prevention and control, FRNSW personnel must observe all Infection Prevention and Control protocols relevant to specific areas. While personal protective equipment (PPE) and vaccination programs afford vital protection, increasing awareness by ingraining infection prevention and control principles into training and incident planning is essential.

Anzac Day 2021

ANZAC Day is a national day of remembrance that goes beyond the anniversary of the landings at Gallipoli in 1915. It is the day on which we remember all Australians who served and died in war operations and on operational service. The spirit of ANZAC, with its qualities of courage, comradeship, and self-sacrifice continues to have meaning and relevance for our sense of National identity.

ANZAC Day March

The aim of the ANZAC Day March is to give the participating veterans, ex-services personnel and the public an opportunity to honour those who served in the defence of Australia or its interests, especially remembering those who paid the supreme sacrifice or otherwise suffered because of their service.

FRNSW has conducted an ANZAC Day Remembrance Service at No. 1 Station, City of Sydney, and has marched as a Unit under Command in the Sydney ANZAC Day March since 1928.

Eligibility to March

Eligibility to march in the ANZAC Day March is determined by the Returned and Services League of Australia. In short, anyone eligible to be a member of the RSL is eligible to participate in the ANZAC Day March. One descendant of a deceased veteran may also honour their relative's service by wearing the relative's medals on their right breast.

COVID-19 Risk Mitigation Requirements

The RSL has approved FRNSW to march as a Unit under Command in the 2021 Sydney ANZAC Day on the following conditions.

- 1) That FRNSW implements an ANZAC Day March Participants COVID-19 Risk Mitigation Plan.
- 2) That all participants intending to march in the FRNSW Contingent pre-register with the FRNSW Contingent Co-ordinator by Thursday 23 April 2021.
- That all FRNSW Contingent participants check-in at No. 1 Station on ANZAC Day via the FRNSW-Services NSW QR Code prior to the commencement of the Sydney ANZAC Day March.

Dress

Dress uniform (full ceremonial) for uniformed personnel. Lounge suit/smart casual for administrative and trades personnel

Protocol for wearing medals.

Current and former FRNSW employees who have been awarded FRNSW Commendations and Awards who wish to honour a relative's war service by wearing their relative's medals should wear the relative's medals on the right breast <u>below</u> their FRNSW Commendations and Awards.

FRNSW ANZAC Day Remembrance Service

FRNSW will conduct the FRNSW ANZAC Day Remembrance Service at City of Sydney Fire Station.

Off duty personnel, families and friends are welcome to attend the FRNSW ANZAC Day Remembrance Service at City of Sydney Fire Station which commences at 07:50 hours on ANZAC Day.

All visitors attending must Check-in via the FRNSW-Services NSW QR-Code.

Anzac Day Leave

Sunday 25 April 2021 is ANZAC Day.

Special leave will be approved for all ex-services personnel and current serving Australian Defence Force Reserve personnel who are rostered for duty on ANZAC Day and who march with the FRNSW Contingent in the **Sydney** ANZAC Day March.

This leave will be approved for the hours that eligible personnel would otherwise have worked between 0800 hours, Sunday 25 April 2021 and 0800 hours, Monday 26 April 2021, and will not be deducted from personal leave credits.

Eligible personnel who desire to march with the FRNSW Contingent must submit an ANZAC DAY LEAVE FORM. Applications for ANZAC Day Leave will close at 0800 hours on Thursday 22 April 2021.

How to apply for ANZAC Day Leave

- 1. Download and complete an ANZAC Day Leave form from the Station Portal.
- 2. Attach proof of your Defence Force Service such as a copy of your Defence Force enlistment or discharge papers; and
- 3. Forward your completed ANZAC Day Leave form, together with your proof of Defence Force Service papers to the ANZAC Day Co-ordinator as follows:

Eligible personnel who fail to submit an ANZAC Day Leave form together with proof of Defence Force Service by Thursday 22 April 2021 will not be granted ANZAC Day Leave.
